EXECUTIVE REPORT

Yipeng Ge, CFMS Director of Government Affairs 2019 CFMS Annual General Meeting (AGM) September 19-22, 2019, St. John's, NL

I. DESCRIPTION OF POSITION

The CFMS Director of Government Affairs (Dir GA) is responsible for addressing the organization's commitment to representation through political advocacy initiatives at a local and national level, both for positive health systems change as well as issues of importance to the student experience of Canadian medical learners. They serve as an ex-officio member of the Government Affairs & Advocacy Representative Roundtable (GAART), organizes the CFMS National Day of Action in collaboration with the National Officer of Political Action (NOPA), coordinates position papers with collaboration with the National Officer of Health Policy (NOHP), and represents the CFMS on all issues of a political nature.

The Dir GA will also actively collaborate with the Director of Education on issues related to medical education that require political involvement. Finally, the Dir GA will represent the CFMS to various external committees and organizations as deemed necessary by the President and CFMS Board.

The CFMS Government Affairs & Advocacy Representative Roundtable (GAART) exists to both solicit the broader opinion of Canadian medical students on a wide variety of issues as well as to help take action at the local, provincial, and national levels. The CFMS GAART is composed of the Chair (Dir GA Attaché) and one to two representatives from each CFMS member school, selected by the individual medical societies. The mandate of the CFMS GAART includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Provide a grassroots framework to determine and advocate for the interests of the CFMS and its membership;
- 2. Cultivate leadership and advocacy skills in CFMS membership, and provide further opportunities for involvement with CFMS;
- 3. Assist with and participate in CFMS national advocacy efforts.

II. PRIORITIES AND PROJECT AREAS

CFMS 2019 Day of Action: Seniors Care and Aging

The CFMS National Day of Action is an annual event where medical students from across Canada gather on Parliament Hill in Ottawa to engage with Members of Parliament (MPs) and other federal policymakers on a pressing topic in Canadian healthcare and to advocate for evidence-based policy recommendations that will have a positive impact on the health of Canadians.

On February 4th, 2019, 76 medical students had 56 meetings with MPs, across the three major federal political parties, including meetings with Ministers, including the Minister of Seniors, Minister of Health, Minister of Veteran Affairs, Minister of Labour, Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations, and President of the Treasury Board. Medical students outlined to policymakers the context of seniors' care and aging in Canada, the opportunities that this group has to offer, and our three policy recommendations that would help Canadians to age with dignity, and with access to necessary supports and appropriate resources. Our three policy recommendations are as follows:

- 1) Commit to targeted funding and development of a National Seniors Strategy for the 2019 federal election.
- 2) Commit to the development of a national evidence-based formulary as a first step towards designing and implementing a truly universal, comprehensive, and cost-effective National Pharmacare Program that provides access to drugs for all Canadians. Work in collaboration with national experts to promote targeted deprescribing to minimize polypharmacy.
- 3) Support national leadership on developing and tracking quality indicators, to enhance the quality of and access to home care, palliative care, and community care provided in the provinces/territories, at the next Federal/Provincial/Territorial Ministers Responsible for Seniors Forum.

Our medical learners are becoming increasingly aware of how the social determinants of health and politics affect the health of our patients. There is significant interest in medical learners to learn the skills of a

health advocate so that they can play an active role in shaping public policy and to create a healthier society for today and tomorrow.

Day of Action 2020: Topic/Issue to be determined

The CFMS Annual General Meeting will provide a space for dialogue to set ideas and agendas for the CFMS Day of Action 2020. The incoming Dir GA, National Officer of Political Action, and the Day of Action Research Committee have been hard at work to produce a short-list of ideas for Day of Action 2020 which will be revealed at CFMS AGM.

Federal Election Strategy and Engagement

The CFMS Advocacy portfolio has been hard at work for the past few months on a federal election strategy from the medical student perspective. We have created a toolkit for medical students to learn more about the federal election and ways to get involved politically (<u>https://www.cfms.org/news/2019/06/18/federal-election-strategy</u>), created a social media campaign asking medical students to think about why they vote titled #IVoteCan or #JeVoteCan, and an election primer outlining medical student identified issues and objective analysis of political party platforms and policies (check out <u>www.cfmsvotes.ca</u> when it launches!). We have also been working closely with the CMA (Canadian Medical Association) and other student, youth, and young professional organizations to collaborate efforts and involve medical students in the federal election process!

Health Human Resource Planning/Physician Resource Planning and the Unmatched Canadian Medical Graduate

The CFMS is continually working across portfolios internally, and constantly advocating and communicating externally, to advance solutions and outcomes to better address the difficult issue of proper physician resource planning and the high number of unmatched Canadian medical graduates. The CFMS advocacy portfolio held advocacy meetings with federal MPs in late-April 2019 to discuss federal and national solutions, and our Atlantic Regional Director met again with the Minister of Health to discuss this issue. We also look forward to collaboration with the CMA (Canadian Medical Association) on this issue.

Committee on Health Policy (COHP)

The Committee on Health Policy has been hard at work over the past few months updating the CFMS advocacy tracker outlining our existing guiding documents and areas of advocacy related to guiding recommendations, reviewing and updating previous guiding documents, and reviewing and providing commentary for incoming papers submitted for AGM 2019. The Committee has also been assisting the development of the CFMS federal election strategy and election primer to engage medical students in the upcoming federal election.

Rapid Response Team

The Rapid Response Team made up of medical students interested in assisting the CFMS in developing materials in response to pertinent and dynamic public and healthcare issues, has formed for its second year and developing priorities to analyse and prepare supporting evidence and analysis for, including national physician licensure and the 2019 federal budget interpretation.

Targeted Task Forces

A variety of targeted task forces within the CFMS advocacy portfolio with representation of medical student membership from across Canada, have been working hard on strategies to move forward on a variety of issues impacting the health and wellbeing of Canadians. A handful of these targeted task forces have brought forward thoughtful and researched guiding documents for hopeful adoption by the assembly at AGM 2019. A few examples of these task forces include: Pharmacare, National Seniors Strategy, Homelessness, Criminal Justice Reform.

Local Initiatives

A multitude of advocacy efforts at local and provincial levels by medical student leaders are certainly worth highlighting and commending for their tremendous leadership and efforts to advance medical learner issues and health systems concerns to enhance the health of Canadians in their communities.
