AS PART OF CHOOSING WISLEY CANADA CAMPAIGN, CANADA'S TWO MEDICAL STUDENT SOCIETIES RELEASE A LIST OF 'SIX THINGS MEDICAL STUDENTS SHOULD QUESTION'

Group aims to encourage medical students to increase awareness about unnecessary care by identifying six things medical students should question.

Toronto, Ontario – The <u>Canadian Federation of Medical Students</u> (CFMS) and <u>Fédération médicale</u> <u>étudiante du Québec</u> (FMEQ), who together represent all medical students in Canada today released a list of <u>'Six Things Medical Students Should Question'</u> as part of <u>Choosing Wisely Canada</u>. The list identifies 6 targeted, evidence-based recommendations that can support conversations about what care is really necessary.

The CFMS/FMEQ list identified the following 6 recommendations:

- 1. Don't suggest ordering the most invasive test before considering other less invasive options.
- 2. Don't suggest a test, treatment, or procedure that will not change the patient's clinical course.
- 3. Don't hesitate to ask for clarification on tests, treatments, or procedures that you believe may be ordered inappropriately.
- 4. Don't miss the opportunity to initiate conversations with patients about whether a test, treatment or procedure is necessary.
- Don't suggest ordering tests or performing procedures for the sole purpose of gaining personal clinical experience.
- Don't suggest ordering tests or treatments pre-emptively for the sole purpose of anticipating what your supervisor would want.

"As medical students, it is important to learn to practice in a way that is data-driven, evidence-based, and is mindful of limited healthcare resources - but which also assures the highest possible quality of care for our patients and their families. This list provides students with a platform to ask tough questions about the role of a test or procedure in the care of their patients. This list was an exciting way for the CFMS, along with our colleagues at the FMEQ, to become a part of the already successful Choosing Wisely Campaign."

The list of 'Six Things Medical Students Should Question' is the culmination of a student-led effort. A student-led taskforce developed an initial list of recommendations, and distributed a survey using social media, as well as CFMS, FMEQ and school-based list servs. Nearly 2000 medical students across Canada responded to the survey. This is the first Choosing Wisely list in Canada, and internationally, developed by students, and related to medical education.

With the release of this list, the campaign will have covered more than <u>160 tests and procedures</u> that specialty society partners say are overused and inappropriate, and that physicians and patients should discuss.

It got underway initially in Ontario and has been endorsed by all provincial and territorial medical associations who have established mechanisms to support the adoption of the Choosing Wisely Canada recommendations. It is now a truly national campaign.
