- A willingness to learn, including a readiness to learn more about CFMS and IFMSA position papers leading up to the Annual Meeting.
- Skills in leadership and diplomacy, as our delegation will be representing Canadian medical students to the IFMSA, and working across cultures with our international neighbours.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills, including a readiness to communicate with colleagues from many different cultures.
- Organization and punctuality, to help ensure a highly effective team.
- A strong commitment to health equity, a commitment that is essential to our work at CFMS and the IFMSA.

- 4. What unique strengths and/or skills do you have to offer?
- 5. How will your participation contribute to CFMS and IFMSA?
